## SACRAMENTAL POLICIES:

**Anointing of the Sick.** This sacrament is provided by a priest to those whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age, or those about to undergo a serious operation. Call Parish Office, 425-255-3132, to ask for a priest.

**Baptism.** To present a child (birth to age 6), parents will attend two classes before the baptism of the child. Baptism is celebrated once a month, during Mass.

**Confirmation** is offered once a year. A Junior or Senior in High School or unconfirmed adults will register in the fall and attend classes and a retreat.

**First Reconciliation and Eucharist.** All Second Grade children are prepared for both sacraments. Parents and children attend classes together. Register in the Fall.

**Sacrament of Matrimony.** Those planning a wedding will need to contact the parish 8 months prior to the intended date. Make an appointment to visit with a priest, begin all necessary paperwork, and meet with a Wedding Coordinator.

**Vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life:** Days of Reflection are offered a few times each year for those considering a vocation to Religious Life. It is also helpful to talk to your pastor, Fr. Gary Zender.

### **Communion to the Sick and the Homebound**

Please call Mary Ann Smith if you are homebound and wish to receive Communion. A Eucharistic Minister will be assigned. If you enter Valley Medical Center through the Emergency Room, have someone call us to bring Communion on Tuesday and/or Thursday. In danger of death, call Father Gary or Father Duc. Admitted at any other hospital, ask for the hospital chaplain's office.

### **Funerals**

Contact the Parish Office (425-255-3132) when you need to make funeral arrangements.

**Catholic Cemetery:** Gethsemane Cemetery serves St. Anthony. Call 253-328-5774 to arrange a visit and/or pre-plan with them. Ask Mary Ann Smith for resources concerning end-of-life decisions.

## **FAITH FORMATION**

The Department of Faith Formation provides ongoing opportunities for all ages to develop a mature faith based on the teachings of Christ and the Tradition of the Roman Catholic Church.

**GoLF—Generations of Living Faith**, is an intergenerational, whole community approach to catechesis that involves all ages and all peoples in our parish. A six-year curriculum covers all the basics of our catholic faith. We have sessions on both Wednesday evenings and Sunday afternoons. Gifts of hospitality, cooking, organizing events, facilitating groups, setting up and cleaning up are needed from volunteers. **Mike Borte**, 425-277-6205.

**Infant Baptism Preparation:** Parents are required to attend two sessions held on Friday evenings and a Saturday morning rehearsal on the weekend of the Baptism. The Baptism is celebrated during mass with the Parish family on the last weekend of the month except for December and March. Call in advance to schedule a preparation session and Baptism date. The parish Baptism Team facilitates the preparation sessions and develops this important ministry.

### **Marriage Preparation**

A six-week Marriage preparation class is available for couples planning on living a sacramental marriage in the Catholic Church. These sessions are held on Wednesday evenings. Call six months in advance to ensure adequate time for marriage preparation. An interview with Fr. Duc must take place prior to the Marriage Preparation classes. He can be reached at 425-277-6197. **Catechesis of the Good Shepherd**, a program for young children uses a multi-sensory method that connects the child to Mass and Catholic culture. Children are prepared to more fully participate in the life of faith. Volunteers and parents are provided with materials, training, and ongoing support.

**Tribunal Advocates or Marriage Advocates** assist with annulment of marriages; processing paperwork with the goal of freeing a person to marry in the Catholic Church. Training is provided by the archdiocese.

### **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)**

RCIA is the process by which adults are welcomed into our Roman Catholic community. It is a journey of mind, heart and spirit for people of all faith backgrounds as they enter into the mysteries of Christ and receive the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. All persons, baptized, un-baptized, catechized and un-catechized are welcome.

RCIA is an ongoing process, and classes begin three times per year (usually September, January and April). Volunteer RCIA sponsors from the parish accompany the participants. They journey toward full initiation into the Catholic faith. Training is provided volunteers.

### **RCIA—adapted for Children**

Children who are 6 years old or older, who have not been baptized Catholic, are enrolled in the RCIA process for Children. This process provides children with a basic understanding of their faith as well as it prepares them for the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. This is a 2 year journey and involves the parents, sponsors and children. A number of volunteers are needed and trained as sponsors, catechist, and assistants.

### **Sacramental Preparation Classes**

Prepares all second grade students to receive Reconciliation and First Communion. All those preparing for the Sacraments must be enrolled in the

Generations of Living Faith Program, and attend the family sessions and specially scheduled opportunities to learn about the sacraments.

### **Returning Catholics**

The team invites those who have been away from the Catholic Church to explore their faith and find new meaning in being a Catholic. Welcoming and answering questions is also part of a team-member's tasks.

### **YOUTH MINISTRY**

Junior High include 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, & 8<sup>th</sup> grade parishioners in area schools. High school programs involve those in 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade. The youth explore their relationship with God and their church community. Service, prayer, liturgical practices, community building, and socials are all a part of the things we do.

There are also retreats, an Archdiocesan Youth Convention, and the Junior High Rally which invite the youth to participate in a Church beyond their local boundaries.

### **Mission Trip**

The high school teens participate in a mission trip to serve the poor during the summer.

### **Confirmation**

The sacrament of Confirmation is offered our youth in grades 11 and 12. Teens participate in Sunday Sessions led by catechists and also attend a Confirmation retreat to help prepare for the sacrament.

**Youth Ministry volunteers** must be interested in working with teens, and able to care for and share with them in a variety of ways from retreats, to prayer, to socials. Also needed are teachers, planners, sponsors, drivers and behind the scenes personnel. Training is provided by the staff and team.

## ADULT MINISTRY

### **S.A.A.M (ST. ANTHONY ADULT MINISTRY)**

This group is especially inviting to young adults, young married, and the young at heart. Weekly prayer and study sessions happen on Tuesday evenings in the Atrium at 7:00 PM. We also meet for socializing and giving service to other members of the community. These tasks are agreed upon among the group and may include being greeters at Mass on Sunday, serving at Coffee and Donuts, helping at Lenten soup Suppers, providing fun at an event, etc.

## LITURGY

All parishioners participate in the life of their parish by attending Mass, praying, listening to the Word of God, receiving communion, singing, and being attentive to all God offers. To continue the “warm and welcoming” environment of St. Anthony is to reach out to visitors and be hospitable hosts and hostesses; be good stewards of the furniture, candles, envelopes, pencils, and space in and around the building.

### LITURGIA

Todos los feligreses participan en la vida de la parroquia al asistir a misa, rezando, escuchando la Palabra de Dios, recibiendo la comunión, cantando y estando atento a todo lo que ofrece Dios. Para continuar en ambiente de “calor y bienvenida” de San Antonio significa dar una mano a los visitante y ser anfitriones hospitalario, respetar los muebles, velas, sobres, lápices, y espacio dentro y alrededor del edificio.

**Acolytes**—assist the priest and deacon and direct the altar servers at weekend and weekday Mass. Anyone in 8<sup>th</sup> grade or older who has previously been an altar server may be an acolyte.

**Acólitos**--- ayudan al sacerdote y diacono a dirigir a los monaguillos en las misas los fines de semana y en misas diarias. Cualquier persona en el 8° grado o mayor que anteriormente fue monaguillo puede ser acolito.

**Altar Servers** assist the priest, deacon, and acolyte at weekend and weekday Mass. Anyone, from 4<sup>th</sup> Grade to adult may be an altar server.

**Monaguillos** ayudan al sacerdote, diacono y acolito en las misas de fines de semana y diarias. Cualquier persona desde el 4° grado a adulto puede ser monaguillo.

**Eucharistic Ministers** help with the distribution of the Eucharist at Mass. Must be confirmed and an active member of the parish.

**Ministro de Eucaristía** ayudan con la distribución de la Eucaristía en la misa. Deben de estar confirmados y ser miembros activos de la parroquia.

**Lectors** proclaim the Word of God to the assembly. Must be a confirmed and active member of the parish. They must be able to articulate clearly in order to be heard and understood. T

**Lectores** proclaman la Palabra de Dios a la asamblea. Deben estar confirmados y ser miembros activos de la parroquia. Deben de articular claramente para que se les pueda escuchar y entender.

**Usher-greeters/Hospitality team** provides a warm and welcoming environment at the doors of the church, seating people, distributing bulletins and are alert to emergency situations if they arise.

**Ministros de Bienvenida** provén un ambiente de calor y bienvenida en las puertas de la iglesia, sientan gente, distribuyen boletines y dan alerta a situaciones de emergencia si es necesario.

**Sacristans** are responsible for ensuring that everything is in order and prepared for the celebration of the various liturgies. Sacristan coordinates with priest, deacon, and all liturgical ministers before, during, and after celebrations.. Anyone who has been confirmed and is a active member of the parish may be a sacristan.

**Sacristanes** son responsables de asegurarse que todo esta en orden y preparado para la celebración de las diferentes liturgias. ## **ST. ANTHONY SCHOOL**

The St. Anthony School community always welcomes your participation and appreciates your help. Stewardship and our commitment to serve others is very important aspect of our mission.
