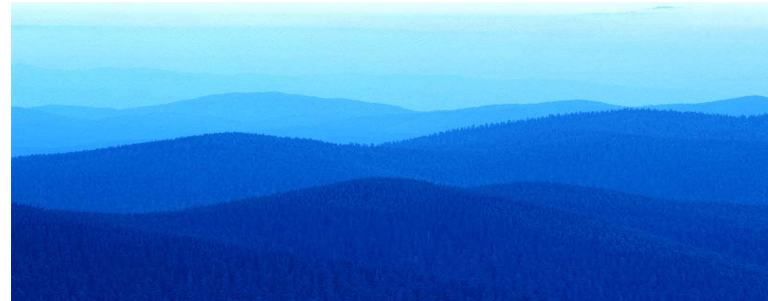

SACRAMENTAL POLICIES:

Anointing of the Sick: This sacrament is provided by a priest to those whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age, or those about to undergo a serious operation. Call **Parish Office**, 425-255-3132, to ask for a priest.

Baptism: Parents are required to attend two sessions held on Friday evenings, 6:30-8:00 PM or Sunday mornings 10:30 to 12:00 plus a Saturday morning 9:00 AM rehearsal on the weekend of the Baptism. The Baptism is celebrated during Mass with the Parish family on the last weekend of the month except for December and March. Call in advance to schedule a preparation session and Baptism date. Call **Mike Borte**

Confirmation is offered once a year. A Junior or Senior in High School or unconfirmed adults will register in the fall and attend classes and a retreat.

First Reconciliation and Eucharist: Elementary-age children at St. Anthony receive their First Reconciliation and First Eucharist after a two-year preparation process. Register in the fall. Call **Andrea King**.

Sacrament of Matrimony: Those planning a wedding will need to contact the parish at least 8 months in advance of intended date. Make an appointment to visit with a priest or deacon. In addition to wedding paperwork and liturgical planning, engaged couples must attend marriage preparation sessions.

Vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life: It is helpful to talk to your pastor who can offer Days of Reflection for those considering a vocation to Religious Life.

Communion to the Sick and the Homebound: If you are homebound and wish to receive Communion, a Eucharistic Minister will be assigned. If you enter Valley Medical Center through the Emergency Room, have someone call to bring Communion on Tuesday and/or Thursday. In danger of death, call a priest. Or call **Mary Ann**.

Funerals: Call the Parish Office to set a funeral date with a priest. You will then be put in contact with a funeral coordinator.

Catholic Cemetery: Gethsemane Cemetery serves St. Anthony. Call 253-328-5774 to arrange a visit and/or pre-plan with them. Ask **Mary Ann Smith** for resources concerning end-of-life decisions.

Prayer Guidelines

When we receive a request to have someone added to the prayer list because of illness, we must ensure the person to be prayed for approves. We are not allowed to ask for or disclose any medical information unless it is voluntarily provided by the person who is ill and they specify that it may be shared with others. Requests to pray for the dead must come from the immediate family. For additional information relating to prayer chains, please contact **Mary Ann Smith**

PARISH LEADERSHIP

PASTORAL COUNCIL

The Pastoral Council serves as a consultative body to the Pastor. Its purpose is to serve the community of St. Anthony by providing vision, goals, priorities, direction and policies through pastoral planning. Members serve a three year term. Names are submitted once a year and appointed to Council. Must be registered members of the parish, fully incorporated in the Catholic Church and support stewardship as a way of life.

FINANCE COUNCIL (Donna Schlager)

The Finance Council serves as a consultative body to the Pastor. Its purpose is to serve the community by providing recommendations concerning fiscal resources. Members serve for three years. Names are submitted once a year and appointed to Council. Must be registered members of the parish, fully incorporated in the Catholic faith, support stewardship as a way of life and be familiar with fiscal accountability.

FAITH FORMATION COMMISSION (Mike Borte)

The team acts as an advisory group to the Faith Formation staff and makes recommendations to the Pastor. It is open to all interested in education of the whole person and the whole family. Members serve a 3 year term.

COMISION HISPANA (Padre Gary)

SCHOOL COMMISSION (Sister Linda Riggers)

This team assists the principal in long-range planning, policy and budget matters. Members must be interested in Catholic School Education.

STEWARDSHIP COMMISSION (Mary Ann Smith)

A group of people that promote Stewardship as a way of life, educate and empower families to share time, talent and treasure.

FAITH FORMATION

The Department of Faith Formation provides ongoing opportunities for all ages to develop a mature faith based on the teachings of Christ and the Tradition of the Roman Catholic Church.

GoLF—Generations of Living Faith, is an intergenerational, whole community approach to catechesis that involves everyone of all ages. A six-year curriculum covers all the basics of our Catholic faith. Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

RCIA is the process by which adults are welcomed into our Roman Catholic community. It is a journey of mind, heart and spirit for people of all faith backgrounds as they enter into the mysteries of Christ and receive the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. All persons, baptized, un-baptized, catechized and un-catechized are welcome.

RCIA is an ongoing process, and classes begin three times per year (usually September, January and April). Volunteer RCIA sponsors from the parish accompany the participants. They journey toward full initiation into the Catholic faith. Training is provided all volunteers.

RCIA—adapted for Children

Children who are 6 years old or older, who have not been baptized Catholic, are enrolled in the RCIA process for Children. This process provides children with a basic understanding of their faith as well as it prepares them for the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. This is a 2 year journey and involves the parents, sponsors and children. A number of volunteers are needed and trained as sponsors, catechist, and assistants.

Sacramental Preparation

Parents are sponsors to their children as they learn about the sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist in a two-year process. Other volunteers may assist in the classroom or in preparing materials. Call to learn more about family options for 1st and 2nd year catechesis.

Tribunal Advocates or Marriage Advocates assist with annulment of marriages; processing paperwork with the goal of freeing a person to marry in the Catholic Church. Training for advocates is provided by the archdiocese. **Call Fr. Gary**, (to consider being an advocate or if you wish to pursue an annulment.)

YOUTH MINISTRY

Junior High include 6th, 7th, & 8th grade parishioners in any school. High school programs involve those in 9th-12th grade. The youth explore their relationship with God and their church community. Service, prayer, liturgical practices, community building, and socials are all a part of the things we do. There are also retreats, an Archdiocesan Youth Convention, and the Junior High Rally which invite the youth to participate in a Church beyond their local boundaries.

Mission Trip

The High School teens participate in a mission trip to serve the poor during the summer. Junior High may participate in a local mission summer trip.

Confirmation

The sacrament of Confirmation is offered our youth in grades 11 and 12. Teens participate in Sunday Sessions led by catechists and also attend a Confirmation retreat to help prepare for the sacrament.

Youth Ministry Volunteers must be interested in working with teens, and able to care for and share with them in a variety of ways from retreats, to prayer, to socials. Also needed are teachers, planners, sponsors, drivers and behind the scenes personnel. Training is provided by the staff and team.

The PADUANS

LITURGY

All parishioners participate in the life of their parish by attending Mass, praying, listening to the Word of God, receiving communion, singing, and being attentive to all God offers. To continue the “warm and welcoming” environment of St. Anthony everyone can reach out to visitors and be hospitable hosts and hostesses; be good stewards of the furniture, candles, envelopes, pencils, and space in and around the building.

LITURGIA

Todos los feligreses participan en la vida de la parroquia al asistir a misa, rezando, escuchando la Palabra de Dios, recibiendo la comunión, cantando y estando atento a todo lo que ofrece Dios. Para continuar en ambiente de “calor y bienvenida” de San Antonio significa dar una mano a los visitantes y ser anfitriones hospitalarios, respetar los muebles, velas, sobres, lápices, y espacio dentro y alrededor del edificio.

Acolytes—assist the priest and deacon and direct the altar servers at weekend and weekday Mass. Anyone in 8th grade or older who has previously been an altar server may be trained as an acolyte.

Acólitos--- ayudan al sacerdote y diácono a dirigir a los monaguillos en las misas los fines de semana y en misas diarias. Cualquier persona en el 8^o grado o mayor que anteriormente fue monaguillo puede ser acólito.

Altar Servers assist the priest, deacon, and acolyte at weekend and weekday Mass. Anyone, from 4th Grade to adult may be trained as an altar server.

Monaguillos ayudan al sacerdote, diácono y acólito en las misas de fines de semana y diarias. Cualquier persona desde el 4^o grado a adulto puede ser monaguillo.

Eucharistic Ministers help with the distribution of the Eucharist at Mass. Must be confirmed and be an active member of the parish.

Ministro de Eucaristía ayudan con la distribución de la Eucaristía en la misa. Deben de estar confirmados y ser miembros activos de la parroquia.

Lectors proclaim the Word of God to the assembly. Must be a confirmed and active member of the parish. They must be able to articulate clearly in order to be heard and understood. Training is available.

Lectores proclaman la Palabra de Dios a la asamblea. Deben estar confirmados y ser miembros activos de la parroquia. Deben de articular claramente para que se les pueda escuchar y entender.

Usher-greeters/Hospitality team provides a warm and welcoming environment at the doors of the church, seating people, distributing bulletins. Ushers are alert to emergency situations if they arise.

Ministros de Bienvenida provén un ambiente de calor y bienvenida en las puertas de la iglesia, sientan gente, distribuyen boletines y dan alerta a situaciones de emergencia si es necesario.

Sacristans are responsible for ensuring that everything is in order and prepared for the celebration of the various liturgies. A Sacristan coordinates with priest, deacon, and all liturgical ministers before, during, and after celebrations. Anyone who has been confirmed and is a active member of the parish may be a sacristan.

Sacristanes son responsables de asegurarse que todo esta en orden y preparado para la celebración de las diferentes liturgias. El sacristán se coordina con el sacerdote o diácono y todos los ministros litúrgicos antes, durante y después de las celebraciones. Cualquier persona que ha sido confirmada y es un miembro activo en la parroquia puede ser sacristán.

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) Provides a resource to younger children to connect with the Sunday readings in a way they can understand. SUPPORT AND OUTREACH

ARISE (Men's Shelter) Volunteers prepare food and serve the men who stay at St. Anthony during the months of February and August.

Chore Ministry Volunteers help the elderly and disabled to maintain independence in their own homes by providing for some of their needs. Chores include shopping, transportation, housekeeping, and laundry.

CROP Walk: A team of volunteers works with other Renton churches to organize people who walk in May for world hunger. Sponsors needed too.

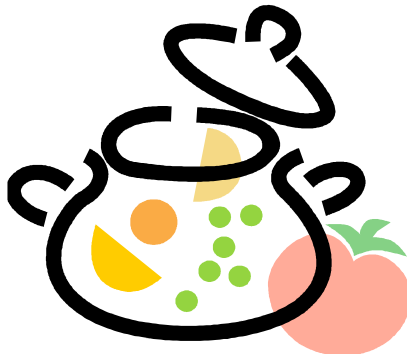

ST. ANTHONY SCHOOL

The St. Anthony School community always welcomes your participation and appreciates your help. Stewardship and our commitment to serve others is very important aspect of our mission. What makes our school so vital is the involvement of all families through their sharing of time, talent and treasure.
